Plans for the Future, Near and Far

High Priority

- 16 New Golf Carts; trade in 14 old models
- Continue greens conversion to “777” bentgrass. More pest resistant, drought tolerant, finer blade of grass, more dense growth. This will allow us to cut the greens at a height of .115-.120 inches, the lower end of the spectrum.
- Remove thatch by pulling micro cores (our new machine does not disrupt play) throughout the season. This promotes a harder putting surface (faster greens, holding shots, less ball marks), healthier root system and better surface drainage.
- Continue to use organic plant/animal based fertilizers.
- Install new tee signs with hole overview, tips and local advertisers.

Medium Priority

- Adding flowers/shrubs to the golf course.
- Rebuild bunker drain on 5/7 fairway bunker.
- Adding in ground yardage markers to par 3 tee boxes.
- Begin a bi-weekly, light topdressing program to dilute thatch buildup.
- Pave the entry driveway
- Add more/clean sand to bunkers

Low priority

- Converting bunker banks to proper grass species (fine fescue blends) to allow a natural look and playability to coexist. Grass blade will get long and “fall over” allowing the golf ball to roll down into the bunker.
- Continue exploring value added capital expenditure projects: Nannobubble irrigation injector, on-course composting restroom, upgrading existing irrigation software.
- Begin converting tees/fairways to modern S1 bentgrass for more disease resistance, faster grow in, and more drought tolerance than current PennTrio species.
- Researching/ speaking to contractors about possibility of building driveway to future clubhouse.
- Run advertising campaign (local businesses) for new tee sign consoles
